1. Introduction

2. Size and Margins

A4 size (210mm × 297mm). 2.5cm for top margin, 3cm for left margin, 2cm for right margin, and 2.5cm for bottom margin. Central page number at 1.5cm from bottom.

3. Main title

Capitalize the first letter of nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs; do not capitalize articles, coordinate conjunctions, or prepositions (unless the title begins with such a word). Please initially capitalize only the first word in other titles, including section titles and first, second, and third-order headings (for example, “Titles and headings” — as in these guidelines).

4. Author name(s) and affiliation(s)

Author names and affiliations are to be centered beneath the title and printed in Times New Roman 12-point, non-boldface type. Multiple authors may be shown in a two or three-column format, with their affiliations below their respective names. Affiliations are centered below each author name, italicized, not bold. Include e-mail addresses if possible. Follow the author information by two blank lines before main text.

5. Type-style and fonts

Wherever Times New Roman is specified, Times Roman, or Times may be used. If neither is available on your word processor, please use the font closest in appearance to Times New Roman that you have access to.

6. Main text

- (1) Chapter & Section Number: in numbers accordingly (I, II, etc.); sections in numbers accordingly (I, (I), I. (1), a. (a) etc.).
- (2) Chapter Title and Section Order:
 - ①Chapter Numbers and Names in the center at the top
 - ②Paragraphs and sections starting from the left of the page, indenting one or two spaces

- (1) Numbers and names of tables are placed above the table; numbers and names of figures below. Sources and illustrations, both tables and figures, are placed below.
- (2) Numbers inside tables and figures should be word-processed or in technical lettering.
